SOCIO-PSYCHOLOGICAL DETERMINANTS OF MODERN YOUTH MOVEMENT

Today, in Ukraine takes place the process of formation of civil society, which is a necessary prerequisite and guarantee of country's development. Implementation of effective state social and humanitarian policy is virtually impossible without the active participation of youth associations in its implementation.

Based on the above, it is possible to formulate the main objectives of the paper, which is implemented in the form of systematic theoretical study of the psychosocial determinants of modern youth movement.

The paper enables to draw the following conclusions. Modern youth movement is a complex social phenomenon and consists of the organized youth, who forms civil associations, and informal self-organized youth initiative, "youth culture", which are mutually complemented. The main socio-psychological determinants of youth movement are self-identity, self-expression and self-realization, which are caused by the social environment coming out of the living conditions of young people and arising in the course of their work, relationships and communication and perform existential, adaptive, communicative, compensatory, identification, regulatory, and transformative self-regulative functional load.

The priority at the current stage of state formation should be increased attention to the youth movement on the part of the government, directing joint efforts on disclosure and implementation of potential of young people in the formation and development of public policy.
